Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare is an integrated healthcare delivery system based in Memphis, Tennessee. Founded in 1918 by The United Methodist Church to help meet the growing needs for quality healthcare, Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare has grown from one hospital into a seven-hospital system that also includes home health services, outpatient surgery centers, minor medical centers, diagnostic centers and a sleep center. Affiliated with the Memphis, Mississippi and Arkansas Conferences of The United Methodist Church, Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare combines a dedication to clinical excellence with a faith-based commitment to care.

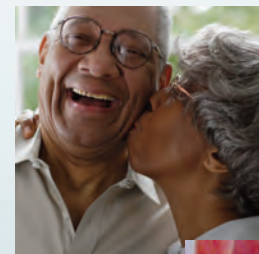

Our Hospitals

Methodist University Hospital is located in the heart of the Memphis Medical Center and has 669 licensed beds. Methodist is proud to be affiliated with the University of Tennessee Health Science Center and serves as its primary teaching site.

A tertiary care and referral center, Methodist University Hospital has one of the largest neurosciences programs in the country, and one of the most active cardiac programs. Methodist University Hospital is also home to a large transplant institute that partners with the University of Tennessee Health Science Center. The program specializes in solid organ transplants of the kidney, liver and pancreas. The hospital also has a new robotic surgery program.

Methodist Extended Care Hospital

Located within Methodist University Hospital is the separately licensed, long-term, 36-bed acute care facility that serves as a “hospital within a hospital.”

Methodist North Hospital

is a comprehensive, acute care hospital serving residents of the Raleigh-Bartlett area of North Shelby County and surrounding areas. The 260-bed facility offers emergency services, extensive cardiac services and surgical capabilities, featuring the da Vinci robot. The hospital also has a Total Joint Center, as well as same-day surgery services, a wound care center and an affiliated rehabilitation facility on campus.

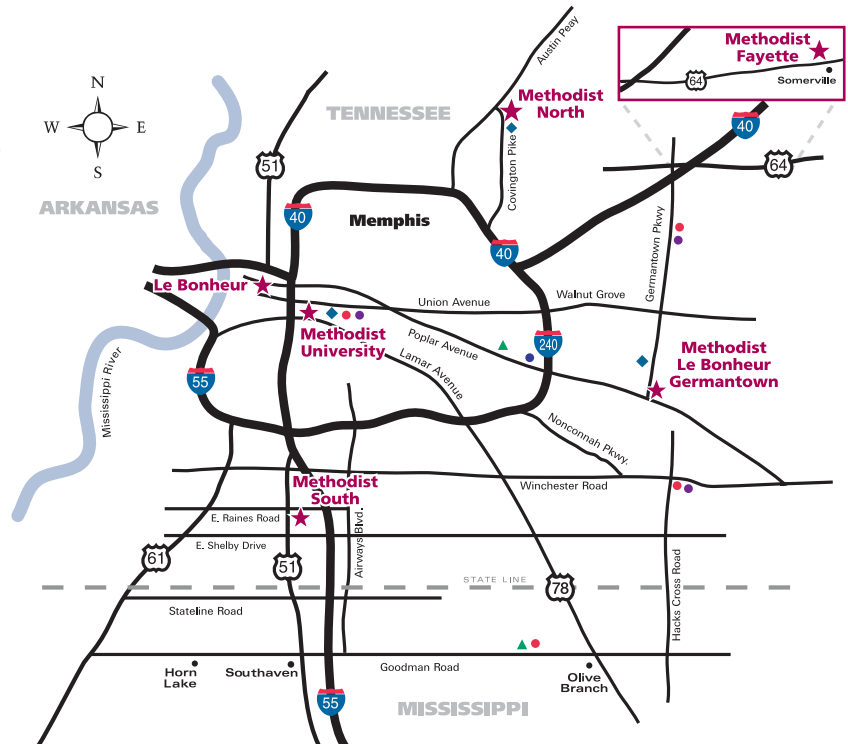
Methodist South Hospital

serves the citizens of South Memphis and surrounding areas. This acute care hospital includes an Emergency Department, award-winning obstetrical program, critical care unit, same-day surgery unit and a complete array of outpatient services. The 200-bed Methodist South Hospital also offers state-of-the-art cardiac services, including cardiac catheterization and open-heart surgery. In late 2007, the Emergency Department began offering a 30-minute guarantee to patients.

Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown Hospital

is a 209-bed acute care hospital serving Germantown, Collierville, East Memphis and North Mississippi. The hospital provides a wide array of services including an Emergency Department, renowned obstetrics and maternity program with a Level III neonatal intensive care unit (NICU), complete surgical services and comprehensive cardiac services. The hospital also features an inpatient pediatric unit and emergency services operated under the exact standards of Le Bonheur Children’s Medical Center. Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown Hospital is currently undergoing a \$124 million expansion and renovation, which includes a new parking deck and Women’s and Children’s Pavilion.

Le Bonheur Children’s Medical Center is the Mid-South’s first and only comprehensive pediatric medical facility. Founded in 1952, Le Bonheur treats 130,000 children from 47 states and many countries. The hospital is home to one of the nation’s 10 busiest pediatric emergency departments and hosts one of the largest pediatric surgical brain tumor programs. It is the teaching site for the University of Tennessee Department of Pediatrics and home to the Children’s Foundation Research Center of Memphis. The new \$327-million Le Bonheur will open in 2010 and will significantly increase the space for patient care, research and teaching.



Methodist Fayette Hospital Located just outside Memphis in Somerville, Tennessee, is a 46-bed community hospital offering inpatient and outpatient services.
