

## New building to offer community physician room

When the new hospital opens this fall, a new community physician room will give community physicians visiting patients a space to call their own.

The new room will serve as office space for physicians while they are seeing patients in the hospital. With desks, computers and a conference table, the room will provide these physicians with a quiet place to access patients' medical records, make phone calls or consult with other doctors.

The current building lacks such a space for community physicians.

"Community-based physicians are an integral part of our medical staff and it's important to provide comfortable, private work space for them when they are rounding in the hospital," said Le Bonheur Administrative Director Janet Phillips.

The new Le Bonheur Physicians' Campaign is one component of the \$100 million, community-wide campaign for the new facility. Since the campaign's start, 100 physicians across the Mid-South have contributed more than \$1.2 million.

## Physicians to create new hospital mural

Le Bonheur is enlisting the help of physicians and Associates to create a mural for the walls of the new hospital.

The project, titled "Mapping Our Lives," has been commissioned as a way to remember and honor the relationships among staff and patients at Le Bonheur. The mural will "map" the paths of their lives and demonstrate how these individuals encounter and impact one another.

In a series of two-hour workshops, physicians and Associates will make and paint clay self-portraits. They may also add special touches along the path to and from Le Bonheur such as their house, garden or school. Local artist Carol DeForest is leading the project.

The hospital is seeking 125 participants to help create the mural. Participants will be split into five workshops held at Le Bonheur and all materials will be provided.

## Lab offers HIV I/II antibody screen, changes measurements

Last month, Le Bonheur Children's Core Laboratory made two changes affecting physicians. First, it began performing the HIV I/II Antibody Screen on the Ortho Clinical Diagnostic ECI instrument. The test is offered seven days a week from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. All positive test results will be confirmed by Western Blot. The specimen type is SERUM (red top tube).

In addition, the unit of measure and reference ranges for CRP changed from mg/dl to mg/L. The reference range changed to 5.0 to 9.0 mg/L. This notice was posted as a blast on Powerchart to be viewed upon login by physicians and other medical staff.

## Neurosurgery clinic to open in Tupelo

Le Bonheur Children's has added a pediatric neurosurgery clinic to its space at North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo.

Pediatric Neurosurgeon Stephanie Einhaus, MD, will see children in the clinic once a month – on the fourth Friday of each month – through the Le Bonheur Outreach Program.

Located in the former Med Serve clinic at 410 Council Circle on North Mississippi Medical Center's campus, the Le Bonheur Outreach Program provides specialty services in pediatric neurology, general surgery, cardiology, pulmonology and now neurosurgery.

Einhaus is double board certified in general neurological surgery and pediatric neurosurgery. She is also an assistant professor in the Department of Neurosurgery at the University of Tennessee. Her special areas of interest include cranial endoscopy and surgery for medically refractory epilepsy in children.
