- The learner will discuss, understand and demonstrate the use of Ultrasound in the pre-hospital setting
- The learner will learn, discuss & understand the use of in-house Ultrasound machine and interpretation of results.
- The learner will discuss & demonstrate appropriate IV/IO insertions and maintenance of access.
- The learner will acquire tips and tools on how to identify personal mental health needs and how to address secondary trauma.
- Share Trauma Survivor experience and how healthcare played a part in his recovery. The learner will learn how their knowledge, skills, and expertise play a part in helping to save lives from trauma.
- The learner will learn about difficult intubations and how to assess for proper airway placement in the trauma pediatric patient. The learner will describe and demonstrate Proper Airway Intubation.
- The learner will learn different burn care approaches to pediatric burns.
- The learner will describe appropriate burn care assessments in the prehospital and in-hospital settings.
